

These are indirect commands in the Greek, the only direct command is: $\mbox{\bf Make Disciples}$

The imperative (make disciples) explains the central focus of the Great Commission, while the Greek participles (translated go, baptising and teaching) describe aspects of the process. (ESV study Bible)

How is Jesus with us?

We know that every believer has been "sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it" Eph 1:13-14

The Holy Spirit also empowers every Christian to be a witness.

Acts 1:8 is very much part of the great commission also,

What does this mean for you and me?

Borrowing from J I Packer's Book Evangelism and the Sovereignty of God, this confidence should cause the following in us:

- 1. It should make us bold
- Even when response isn't what we want.
- It make us patient God is sovereign and saves in his own time. It is the Holy Spirit who convicts and regenerates.
 We need stickability
- 3. It should make us prayerful
 We cannot fulfil the great commission by ourselves, we need God and each other!
 Prayer aligns our perspective with that of God.
